5. An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organisation.
6. All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.
7. An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.
8. An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level.
9. An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
10. If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select three suitable individual exhibits and, with the exhibitor's permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.
11. It is the responsibility of the Group Secretary and winner to co-ordinate the transfer of the winning entry to the ASC Office in Sydney for the State judging.
12. Recommendation: State Final garments are to include a photo of the garment being worn (where possible and applicable).

1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
250g butter
250g soft brown sugar
½ teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind
½ teaspoon almond essence
½ teaspoon vanilla essence
4 large eggs



RECOMMENDED METHOD: Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared **square 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") tin** and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Note: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces

3/4 cup milk	2 tablespoons cocoa—slightly rounded

Method

1. Grease and line a 20cm round tin.
2. Place all ingredients into a bowl & beat until the chocolate mixture changes colour & all the ingredients are combined. (A food processor can be used if you prefer.)
3. Pour the mixture into the tin. Bang the tin lightly on the bench to even out the mixture.
4. Cook in a moderate oven for about 1 hour (this will depend on your oven) until cake is cooked.

Hint: If your cake cracks on top this is usually a sign your oven temperature is too hot.

Hint: The cake will be ready when it springs back when touched in the centre, and the edge of the cake comes away from the tin.

5. Ice on top with chocolate icing after cake has cooled.

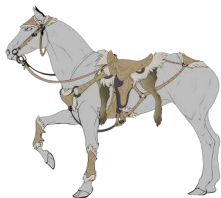

Direct Deposit of your winnings can be arranged at the Secretary's office. Prizes not collected by the end of the calendar month of February will be treated as sponsorship for the following year.

PLEASE NOTE

All exhibitors and competitors will be required to pay gate entry the grounds on Saturday, unless they are a member of the show society.

Membership

You are invited to become a member of the Gulgong Show Society to support the organisation that is advertising the Gulgong District. By becoming a member you will not only be supporting the continuation of the annual show which showcases the hard work of many locals every year, but you will also enjoy the following privileges of membership:

- A ticket of membership
- The right of admission to the showgrounds on show day
- The right of admission to the showgrounds on show day for your children who attend with you and are under 18yrs old
- The right to attend and vote at any held meeting
- The committee's gratitude for your support
- Complimentary paper show schedule if requested

Membership Fees To be a financial member of the show society membership fees must be paid in the financial year: that is 1st July to 30th June in any given year.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

General Regulations apply to all event participants. They govern entry, judging, safety, and compliance. Special Regulations take precedence over General Regulations when relevant. If documents conflict, precedence is legislation, constitution, special regulations, general regulations, code of conduct, conditions of entry.

Refer also to the Code of Conduct and Conditions of Entry for Showgrounds.

1. Who Must Comply

All exhibitors, competitors, commercial traders, officials & volunteers. Compliance with the Code of Conduct is mandatory

2. Exhibit Entries

Submit entries correctly and on time; waiver forms and wristbands as required.

Exhibitors must prepare/care for exhibits; false entries are not allowed.

No ribbons other than those awarded at the show to be placed on any exhibit whilst on the showgrounds . All exhibitors of livestock must be the bona fide owners at the time of entry . All fruit, vegetables, flowers, pot plants must have been grown by the exhibitor, all jams, preserves, honey & cakes must have been cooked by the exhibitor, all art works must be that on the exhibitor All crafts and needlework must have been made by the exhibitor, and all photographs must have been taken in the last 12 months (from date of show)

No exhibit (livestock excluded) to be removed from before 7pm on the evening of the show. Any person infringing this rule may be liable to be disqualified from exhibiting at any future show and if a prize was awarded, such prize may be forfeited

No prize money is paid if prize is a product or service

3. Judging and Awards

Each section has set criteria; judges' decisions are final. Awards may be withdrawn if rules are broken or judge deems exhibits unworthy of prize. Stewards are permitted to enter classes their own section as long as the judge is not advised of ownership

4. Animal Welfare

Must comply with animal welfare and biosecurity laws. Animals should be healthy; unfit animals can be removed by the committee.

5. Safety & Risk

All relevant laws must be followed, including Work Health and Safety Act.

Equipment/displays must be safe; hazards reported immediately.

6. Conduct & Behaviour

Respectful, ethical behaviour required; disruptive actions may lead to disqualification or removal.

7. Advertising & Sales

All promotions need pre-approval based on safety, compliance, product suitability.

No unauthorised advertising. The Show Society is authorised to run a raffle and/or 100 club

8. Disputes & Complaints

Lodge protests per Complaints Policy. Must be lodged prior to 3pm on day of competition Committee's decision is final unless sent to AgShows NSW Disciplinary Committee.

9. Penalties

Breaches may result in warnings, fines, disqualification, removal, or bans. The Committee can refuse/cancel entries and discipline improper behaviour. Judges can withhold prizes or disqualify non-compliant exhibits. Protests require a \$50 deposit; false statements can lead to multiple penalties. Specific rules exist for exhibit ownership, exhibit removal, vehicle access, vermin/disease control, and raffle operations.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Introduction: The Code of Conduct applies to everyone attending or participating in Gulgong Agricultural Show events, including patrons, exhibitors, competitors, traders, officials, volunteers and contractors. This Code outlines the behavioural expectations to ensure all events are safe, respectful, inclusive and enjoyable for all. It complements the Conditions of Entry for Showgrounds (for patrons and visitors) and the General Regulations (for exhibitor, competitors and traders) providing a shared set of values and standards. All individuals are responsible for understanding and following this Code, as well as any other relevant rules or policies that apply to their role at the event.

Document Hierarchy Clause: In the event of any inconsistency or conflict between the provisions of Gulgong Show Society Inc governance and operational documents, the following hierarchy shall apply in determining precedence:

- Applicable legislation and statutory requirements
- The Constitution of Gulgong Show Society Inc
- Any Special regulations issued by Gulgong Show Society Inc
- The General Regulations of Gulgong Show Society Inc
- The Code of Conduct of Gulgong Show Society Inc
- The Conditions of Entry to the Gulgong Showgrounds

All documents should be read in conjunction with this hierarchy.

1 Expected Behaviour

All attendees, exhibitors, competitors, traders, officials and volunteers must:

- Treat everyone with respect, fairness and courtesy.
- Respect the welfare of Animals
- Follow Safety instructions at all times,
- Act honestly, ethically and with integrity
- Avoid bullying, harassment, discrimination or offensive conduct
- Ensure animal welfare practices are upheld
- Comply with all relevant rules and policies Including Conditions of Entry for Gulgong Showgrounds (patrons and visitors) and General Regulations (exhibitors, competitors and traders)

2 Social Media Conduct

Use social media responsibly. Platforms including Facebook, Instagram, X (formerly Twitter), TikTok, Snapchat, YouTube, LinkedIn and online forums must not be used to harass, bully or discredit Gulgong Show Society Inc, its show, participants or officials. Prohibited content includes offensive, defamatory, misleading or unauthorised use of images, including of minors.

Respect privacy when posting photos/videos and ensure compliance with privacy guidelines when photographing children. Breaches of this clause may result in sanctions as outlined in Section 5.

3 Child Safety

Everyone has a duty to protect children and vulnerable persons. Inappropriate behaviour towards children will be reported to the NSW Department of Communities and Justice and/or the NSW Police, in line with relevant legislation. Within Gulgong Show Society Inc, any concerns must be reported to the Secretary's office or Show Committee President, who will escalate the matter through the appropriate channels.

4 Prohibited Conduct

- Bullying, harassment or intimidation
- Violence, abuse or unsafe conduct
- Theft, vandalism or fraud
- Being under the influence of drugs/alcohol while working, volunteering, competing or performing duties
- Mistreatment or neglect of animals
- Breaches of General Regulations or Conditions of Entry to the Showgrounds

5 Complaints & Breaches

Concerns to be raised with the Show Committee or officials in a timely manner. Formal complaints should follow the Show Guidelines. Breaches may result in:

- Warnings (verbal and written)
- Removal from the Showground
- Suspension or bans from future events
- Referral to authorities where necessary

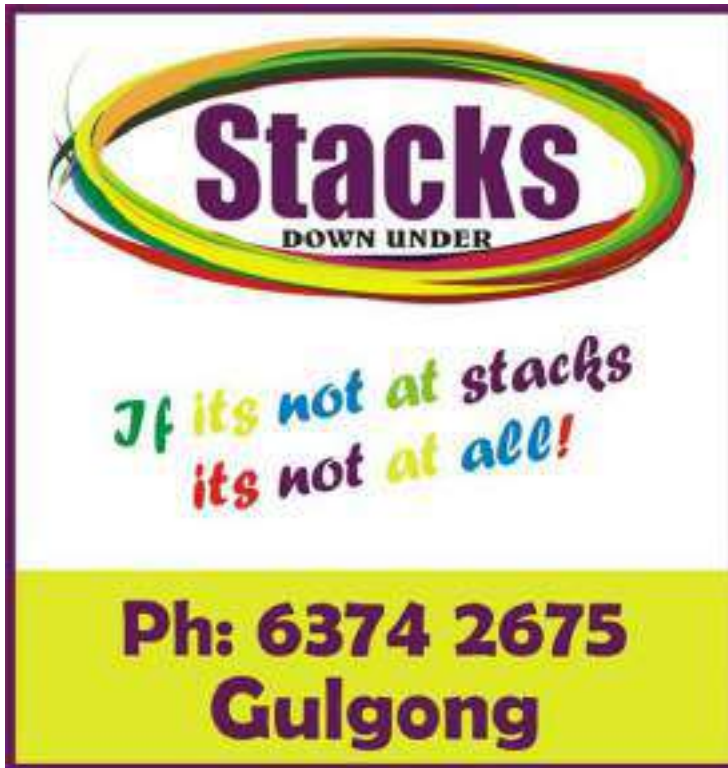

The decision-maker will be the Gulgong Show Society Inc Committee or Event Manager as appropriate. Appeals may be made in writing to the AgShows NSW Executive Officer for review.
